


market update

As is customary in summer, the housing market slowed in July. The Real Estate Board of Greater Vancouver (REBGV) reports that the home sales total last month for the metro region was below the 10-year average for July.

Although the total residential property sales of 2,571 units represented a 14% increase over the very low levels of July 2010, sales were 21% fewer than in June 2011. At 15,226, the total number of residential property listings on the MLS® at July 31 was 1% higher than at the end of June, although 7% lower than in July 2010. The sales to active listings ratio slipped to just under 17%.

North Shore home sales, at 295 units, were down by almost 24% from June. Sales were, however, 27% higher than in July 2010. As illustrated in the chart, the sales to active listings ratio on the North Shore was 21%, down from 31% in June and indicates that market conditions between homebuyers and sellers continue to become more balanced.




In July, North Shore single-family homes sold on average in 59 days compared to 48 days for those sold in June, and 73 days for July 2010 sales.




Units Sold




properties sold, as a % of properties for sale at end of month
