

market update

The Real Estate Board of Greater Vancouver (REBGV) reported total MLS® residential property sales of 2,360 units in November representing a 2% increase over the levels of October, and 6% fewer than in November 2010. At 14,090, the total number of residential property listings at November 30 was 9% less than at the end of October, and 13% more than at the end of November 2010. The metro MLS® sales to active listings ratio reversed its recent downward trend and increased to almost 17%, representing a return to balanced market conditions.




North Shore home sales, at 289 units, were down by 7% from October although 5% higher than in November 2010. Of note, sales of North Shore single-family homes fell by 22% while condo sales increased by 13%, compared to October. The sales to active listings ratio on the North Shore rose to 23%, up from 21% in October, and suggests the local housing market is firmly in balance and favoring neither buyers nor sellers.

In November, North Shore single-family homes sold on average in 73 days compared to 71 days in October, and 111 days in November 2010. For the complete November 2011 REBGV market report, click on www.danmuzzin.com/news.html.




Units Sold




properties sold, as a % of # of properties for sale at end of month
