market update

Home sellers outpaced buyers on Greater Vancouver's MLS® in June, suggesting the market may be trending back toward balance, favouring neither sellers nor buyers. Residential property sales amounted to 3,262 units in June representing a 3% decrease from May and 10% more than in June 2010. At 15,106, the total number of residential property listings on the MLS® at June 30 was 3% higher than at the end of May, although 14% lower than in June 2010. The sales to active listings ratio slipped to just under 22%.

In June, North Shore home sales amounted to 464, 2% more than in May, and 46% more than were sold in June 2010. As illustrated above, the sales to active listings ratio on the North Shore was 31%, the




active listings ratio on the North Shore was 31%, the same as in May and indicative of market conditions that continue to favour sellers.

North Vancouver




Units Sold




properties sold, as a % of properties for sale at end of month

monthly sales by neighbourhood (call me for sales details in your local area)






HST referendum

HST referendum ballots have now started arriving in voters' mailboxes. Due to delays resulting from the Canada Post labour dispute, the referendum deadline has been extended to 4:30 p.m. on August 5, 2011 (even though the voting package instructions still show the deadline to be July 22).

Voters are asked to vote **No** if they want to keep the HST. Premier Christy Clark has vowed to reduce the tax from its present 12% rate to 11% in 2012 and to 10% in 2014.

Voters are asked to vote **Yes** to eliminate the HST and return to the combined Federal GST (5%) and Provincial PST (7%?).



Voters can either mail in their ballot using the postage paid envelope provided with the ballots, or return their ballot to a Service BC or Elections BC collection centre. For in-person return locations, visit www.elections.bc.ca.

If you don't receive a ballot or you lose your ballot and need a replacement, phone Elections BC at 1.800.661.8683 toll-free. The deadline to request a ballot is midnight, July 22, 2011.

Referendum results will be released by September 2011.
